RENTAL ASSISTANCE

Rental Assistance Program (Families):

For parents with at least one child, who are working and earn \$40,000 or less (before-tax).

Shelter Aid for Elderly Renters Program (SAFER): For low income seniors 60+.

Canada-BC Housing Benefit Program:

For people who do not qualify for BC Housing Rental Assistance Programs.

EMERGENCY LOAN RENTAL PROGRAM

North Okanagan Rent Bank: A <u>one-time loan</u>

available to renters (with low- to moderate incomes) who experience a short-term financial challenge (eg. dental bill, car repair) that puts them at risk of being evicted or having essential utilities being cut off.

BC Housing Registry:

1. Get the Housing Registration Service Application form

- Registration is on a first-come, first-serve basis and is dependent on bed availability
